Spain: Navantia, Reganosa and Gas Natural Comercializador a Form New Alliance



Navantia, Reganosa and Gas Natural Comercializadora have signed a framework agreement to offer a comprehensive service that completes the repair cycle of gas carrier ships to bring them into operation, guaranteeing an even more attractive and competitive product for the operators of the ships, as well as generating more activity in the Ferrol estuary.

Through this alliance between the three companies, clients will get greater added value and at the same time Ferrol will consolidate its position as a big international centre for the gas sector.

The document was signed in the regasification plant by Miguel Rodríguez Lorenzo, Director of Repairs Fene-Ferrol for Navantia; Emilio Bruquetas Serantes, Director General of Reganosa; and José Nemesio Rodríguez Maneiro, Director of Sales of Gas Natural Comercializadora. The framework agreement has already entered into effect, although the parties have agreed to have the legal structures in place that will govern relations between the three companies within thirty days.

Navantia has taken on the commitment to offer its clients this comprehensive repair service for gas carrier ships, including inerting, cooling of tanks, supply of the liquefied natural gas (LNG) needed to complete the repair cycle and making the vessel operational, etc., all of which can be done at the regasification plant. For its part, Gas Natural Comercializadora will

guarantee the availability of LNG at stable prices set sufficiently in advance, while Reganosa will provide the tankers with any services they require.

This joint offer is of great interest to companies and the region, given the location of the shipyard and the regasification plant in the same estuary, which in turn is situated at a strategic point on the Atlantic coast, where there is a large volume of marine traffic shipping LNG.

Though newly established the company already took delivery of her second newbuilding vessel in July 2012, a 34,175 MT DWT bulk carrier named M/V Delta. What makes M/V Delta special is that she is equipped with 4 x 36 MTMcGregor electric cranes of advanced technology, which move silently, with great precision and are 30% more economic than the standard electrohydraulic ones. Furthermore, she is designed and built by Dae Sun Shipbuilding & Engineering Co Ltd at Busan, Korea with a shallow draft that allows her to operate even in restricted draft ports often found in emerging economies which makes her even more competitive comparing to other vessels of the same capacity.

M/V Delta was named by Mrs Tina Moundreas at a special ceremony at Dae Sun Shipyard. She is flying the Liberia flag and her class is DetNorkeVeritas. Her Master is Captain Reynaldo Caasi and the Chief Engineer is Mr Ronaldo Maningo.

Load Line Marine SA currently also manages M/V Charlie, sister vessel of M/V Delta, delivered in June 2011 and M/V Alpha a 28,000 MT DWT bulk carrier built in Japan from Hitachi Zosen S/Y in 1984. In April 2013, the delivery of the company's third newbuilding vessel M/V Copenship Eco is expected, a 64,000 MT DWT eco-type ultramax bulk carrier that will be able to carry 15% more cargo than the typical Supramax, while consuming 17% less bunkers.

Turkish Fuel Distributor Buys Pair of Product TankersThe

THY OPET, a Turkish company formed as a joint venture of the Turkish Airlines and fuel distributor OPET, has reportedly bought a pair of oil/chemical tankers from Fiona Shipholding S.A. for USD 11mill each, Lion Shipbrokers said in their latest Weekly Report.

Both vessels, DIPLOMAT and NEGOTIATOR, were built at South Korean shipyard Sekwang in 2007. The 13,027 DWT product tankers, Nippon Kaiji Kyokai classed, were operated by Evalend Shipping Tankers CO. S.A before the sale.

Turkish media reported on November 24th that the current position of MT DIPLOMAT was Tuzla, Istanbul anchorage while MT NEGOTIATOR was sailing near Gibraltar.
